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Natural and genuine Occo Geode Halves from Brazil. They have been cut and polished and have centers that may contain druzy quartz, quartz crystals, chalcedony, or beautifully detailed agate. Some say these are named for their source, the Orinoco River in Brazil. Because their outer shell of chalcedony is relatively thin and often rope-like in formation these geodes are easily identified. When cut, Occos display brilliant drusy quartz linings on tan, grey, brown or black shells with white waves or flames. Many Occos have inclusions in the quartz, rarely amethyst.
